Mid-September and not a single red tomato! I take this personally. No matter that it was a weird cool summer or that no one around me has red tomatoes either. This is a personal affront! I did everything right!

At every stage of life we have Green Tomato problems. The extreme pressure-cooker of competition for youth is troubling. Don't make it into the right pre-school and the rest of your life will collapse like a row of dominos. And, if you have learning problems you are often just out of the picture. Ok, suppose you do all the right things and graduate from the right college with the right degree. There is a recession. Your dreams collapse. Green Tomatoes. It

just keeps going on throughout life. I get some of the same "unfair" frustrations in my supposedly "Golden Years".

My thoughts jumped to Viktor Frankl (1905-1997). Kind of a big jump from Green Tomato experiences to the pioneer Existential Psychiatrist. Frankl began his healing career with Viennese university students who failed in some way and felt their life was over. Suicide was rampant. His efforts helped to turn that around, and in time led him into general issues of the vacuums which sometimes consume us with emptiness, boredom, apathy. Then it became personal when Frankl was a slave laborer in a Nazi concentration camp. In this Hell he discovered the essential human need to always find meaning in life, especially in the midst of suffering. I always want to remember one of his great statements:



**When we are no longer able to change a situation –
we are challenged to change ourselves.**

Ok. Chances are many of the tomatoes will ripen. How nice for us to have them in October and to be canning sauce when it is cooler. But also there is beauty all around me now. Not in the garden perhaps but if I lift up my face, as the Psalms keep reminding me, the beautiful colors of autumn are beginning just outside the garden. I know this is pretty trivial compared to those who are facing making choices between paying for medicine or food. Or have uncertain medical futures. But, perhaps this year of the Green Tomatoes will remind me that it is possible to find meaning in life despite the frustrations, disappointments, and even sufferings that will come my way.

Starcross Christmas Faire —


